Projects

- Out of hours survey follow-up In 2010 a survey went out to ECMC Research Nurse Network members to find out about the out-of-hours system in place for clinical trial patients, across the ECMC Network. The results were presented in a poster at the NCRI conference in 2010. Now is an appropriate time to revisit these questions and see if/how systems have changed
- Mapping of structure at ECMCs due to various ways that ECMCs run, the steering committee is going to map the different structures at ECMCs. This project could lead to further work on job satisfaction and appropriate workloads in relation to the different structures
- NIHR Research Nurse Strategy members of the ECMC Research Nurse Steering Committee are getting involved in the developmental theme areas of the NIHR's Research Nurse Strategy.
