

Call for new members for the ECMC Junior Investigator Network Group (JING) **Steering Committee**

The ECMC JING Steering Committee is looking for new members to join the committee. This is a great opportunity as members will have the chance to:

- Network with other scientists/clinicians (from the adult and paediatric ECMCs across the UK) who are establishing themselves as independent researchers
- Increase your understanding of the ECMC and contribute to its evolving role in drug development

Who are we looking for:

- Any early career cancer researcher committed to becoming an independent investigator, such as clinical colleagues wishing to specialise in a cancer-relevant field and from final year of PhD onwards for non-clinical colleagues
- Junior investigators up to the point of completing your first programme or project grant
- For this round of applications, we are especially interested in applicants from surgery, paediatrics, radiology/clinical oncology (clinical) and nonclinical including statisticians

Commitment

- The Steering Committee has meetings at least four times per year primarily via Teams and members are expected to attend at least two of these meetings (or, at the very least, contribute to the agenda/minutes of 2/3 meetings) and to contribute up to 5 hours/month on network projects/reviewing network documents
- Membership of the committee is for three years in the first instance
